A Message from the President-CEO

It's That Time of Year Again...

abor Day has passed, and school is in session, both in our community and at the ABC Keystone training facility. With the passing of Labor Day, we also mark the beginning of a new Apprenticeship school year, and several changes were made by the Apprenticeship Training & Trust Board over the summer months in order to raise the program to a new level. Two changes in particular were the move to full-time instructors and secondly to insure enough was budgeted to provide the materials and equipment needed to expand the hands-on experience.

The Keystone Chapter has started the 2019/2020 school year with high marks! For the first time, based on the records I could find, Keystone surpassed 400 apprentices in our program. As of this writing, we have 408 students enrolled, and we will continue to take registrations for our Heavy Equipment classes that start in January. Of those 408, 185 students are new to the program. Again, a new high-water mark!

While these numbers are great news, we still have a lot of work to do in order to fill the pipeline and replace the 40% of our industry who are projected to leave over the next 10 years. If you have not heard yet, Keystone offers Pre-Apprenticeship. We ran a pilot program with six students in the spring. This program put these high school seniors through 12 weeks of education, one day a week, learning our Core curriculum. This curriculum is germane to all trades. Therefore, these students can now enter the industry in any trade as an entry-level field employee, and enter our apprenticeship program, saving themselves and their employer the time and cost of the first semester. I am pleased to inform you that our fall class for pre-apprenticeship is sold out at 18 students.

As we continue to work on the pipeline, I want to remind you that with October comes our fall session of "Construction Wars." On October 15, 16, and 17, we will host 200 middle school students and provide them an intro to hands-on experience in the trades. Will any of these students enter a career in construction? If we as an industry do not do our part to inform them, the answer will be "no." This is our third year and our fourth session providing this program, and based on the quick

responses of school districts to register students for this now filled-to-capacity event, I would contend we have become "the place" for construction careers awareness.

With so many things happening in apprenticeship, preapprenticeship and our middle school program, you will see many communications and updates on social media and in various print media during the entire month of October. October is officially "Careers in Construction Month." We at ABC Keystone will do our part to highlight this industry for the opportunities it provides and why we are so passionate about Careers in Construction. Join us in celebrating by viewing a class, volunteering for Construction Wars, or sending a note on what you are doing to promote the industry we all love.

Advocacy Update

Why Local Elections Matter

his November, you will have the opportunity to vote for candidates running for local government. The winners of these elections will serve as school board director, county commissioner, city or borough council person, township supervisor, mayor, among others. Generally, voter participation and interest in "off-year" municipal elections are very low. This is unfortunate, as local elected officials are most directly connected to you and your business.

In the construction industry, the people that serve in local office are important, as they decide on matters directly impacting our work, from zoning to permitting. Local officials can also take up workforce issues the state has not acted upon, if they are not preempted. In that regard, ABC is working hard to advocate locally on two specific policy issues that promote free enterprise:

Fair and Open Competition on Construction Contracts:

Through ABC's leadership, three counties in Pennsylvania (Lancaster, Lebanon, and Berks) passed ordinances that will ensure fair and open competition for taxpayer-funded construction projects. We want more counties to follow suit. Far too often, government entities enter into a project labor agreement (PLA) which forces open shop contractors to subject themselves and their employees to a collective bargaining agreement in order to receive the contract. In other words, a non-union contractor must agree to the terms and conditions of a union, going as far as being forced to hire workers through a union hall or hire apprentices exclusively through union apprenticeship programs.

ABC PA is opposed to the use of PLAs, as it goes against the core fabric of the free enterprise system. We are reaching out to county commissioners across the Commonwealth to educate them on PLAs and explain why they are anti-competitive. The people you elect to local office will have an impact on our future work. Get involved and ask your county commissioner candidates where they stand on PLAs!

Right-to Work:

Another threat to free enterprise is coercion to pay union dues as a condition of employment. Thankfully, the national

spotlight has been put on this issue, resulting in the landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision, Janus v. American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, Council 31, which ruled public employees cannot be forced to pay dues if they choose not to join a union. We believe these same principles should be applied to the trades.

Across the nation, 26 states passed "right-to-work" laws, which, much like the Janus decision, says union contracts cannot force workers to pay dues. In some states where right-to-work has not passed, local elected officials have stepped up to take matters into their own hands. In Kentucky and neighboring Ohio, county governments decided to protect workers' freedom and declared forced union dues as unlawful. If you see your county commissioner, ask if they would be willing to pass a local right-to-work law banning coerced union dues. Tell them to support freedom in the workplace!

The above examples point to why local control and local elections are so vitally important. Do not miss the opportunity to take part in the democratic process. Vote on November 5. Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. If you are unsure of your polling location, go to https://www.pavoterservices.pa.gov/Pages/PollingPlaceInfo.aspx for more information.

Is the Golden Rule Dead?

huge topic of many management training courses/seminars that I've attended is the challenge and opportunity of three different generations of employees and business owners working at the same time. People often interpret the various generations within the workforce as a negative problem that is causing conflict. I would like to share the perspective of a Young Professional that is a part of the "millennial generation."

I heard a comment during a conference call between Young Professionals across the county that has changed my perspective greatly. The speaker stated that we all needed to stop following the "Golden Rule." Having grown up hearing "treat others as you wish to be treated," my initial reaction was doubt and dismissal. This was the well-known saying that people have used to tell people to treat each other fairly and appropriately. How can we just throw it out the window?

Our society has always taken the assumption that you are treating people fairly and appropriately if you are treating them as you would treat yourself. The logic of the "Golden Rule" is appropriate if everyone thinks and acts the same way. This is obviously not the case, especially with individuals from three generations interacting and conducting business together on a daily basis. The people with whom you are interacting may not have the same perspective as you. Therefore, treating them exactly as you would treat yourself may not be appropriate with that individual.

We need to rewrite the "Golden Rule" to "treat others as they wish to be treated." You must take the time to get to know the individuals with whom you are interacting with and treat them as they desire to

be treated. The way you respond to the exact same situation may be different with different people, depending on their background and personality.

In conclusion, I think we need to hold off on throwing the "Golden Rule" out the window. We do, however, need to adjust the wording a little. The world as a whole has changed significantly in recent years. The interactions between various cultures and ages have increased dramatically. To be an efficient leader, businessperson, friend, coworker, etc., we must get to know people and treat them accordingly. It is easy to have a default response based on your experiences. 

he announcement was made at the 2019
Inaugural that the Keystone Chapter is partnering
with Hands-on House Children's Museum of Lancaster
to produce a new construction-themed exhibit at the
nonprofit education center. ABC Keystone will be the
main sponsor for the exhibit, slated to open in early
2020 and geared towards elementary-school ages. The
exhibit will teach children about different occupations
and trades in the construction field, supporting
construction industry workforce development. By now,
you might be asking yourself, "What will it look like?"


Titled "HOH Construction Co.," the planned exhibit will allow children and their families to simulate entering a job site, where they will first "STEP Up to Safety" — with the opportunity to put on hard hats, gloves, and vests - and then choose from a set of tools related to their chosen construction trade. As they interact with the many elements of the exhibit, children and parents will learn about the career opportunities provided by the construction industry in addition to education and training paths available such as apprenticeship. ABC Keystone's apprentices will take part in building much of the structure for the exhibit itself, and elements of this production will be available for children and students to see as they explore the exhibit.

A Hands-on "Build" House, a framed structure in different stages of completion, is planned as the center point of the exhibit, including areas for different trades to be highlighted, such as pulling wire as an electrician, affixing PVC pipe as a plumber, finishing trim as a carpenter, and building a brick wall as a mason, among other skills. This structure is proposed as a multi-floor clubhouse, built at a height that allows parents to interact with their children and discuss with them all that they are learning.

Additional proposed exhibit elements include:

- Foreman's Station, where blueprints can be reviewed;
- Excavating Zone, consisting of contained foam dirt and rubber boulders;
- Concrete Mixer, a hand-turned mixer with wheelbarrows;
- Trade Stations, explaining more about each trade and how they work together to finish a project.



The timed competition followed a similar format as the upcoming National Competition, and apprentices were challenged to follow plans to craft projects that tested their skills, knowledge and attention to safety. The competition has two components: the written test, which counts for 25% of their total score; and the practical "hands-on" competition, which counts for 75% of their total score.

In addition to showcasing their top-quality work, the competitors must also adhere to strict safety standards. They are challenged throughout the day by having to maintain focus in a busy environment with spectators just as they will be at the National Competition.
