2022 PRIMARY ELECTION OVERVIEW



Election Day: Tuesday, May 17

Polls Are Open: 7 a.m. – 8 p.m.

OBJECTIVE

This Election Day overview is intended to provide biographical information to ABC Pennsylvania members about candidates seeking office at the state and federal level in the Pennsylvania primary.

In 2022, all 203 seats in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives are up for election, as are 25 seats in the Pennsylvania Senate in even numbered districts. Voters will also elect a new governor, U.S. Senator and a member of the U.S. House of Representatives across 17 congressional districts.

The election will have an impact on Pennsylvania's future, including how the commonwealth responds to critical workforce needs. That is why ABC Pennsylvania believes it is important to support candidates who are committed to defending free enterprise and the merit shop philosophy.

ABC Pennsylvania is comprised of five regional chapters, representing nearly 1,400 member companies. Our mission is to defend fair and open competition in the construction industry.

VOTER REGISTRATION

To vote in Pennsylvania, eligible voters must register with the Department of State. Registration must be completed at least 15 days before the election, which is **Monday, May 2**. First-time voters must show proof of identification at their polling location. Information on how to register can be found [here](#).

If you are a registered voter and moved, had a name change or wish to change your party affiliation, your registration needs to be updated with the new information, which can be done [online](#). Changes must be made by **May 2** to be effective for the primary election.

→ WHO'S RUNNING FOR GOVERNOR?

The Nine Republican Candidates:



Lou Barletta (Luzerne County)

Barletta started his career in Hazleton, where he served as a city councilman and mayor. In 2010, he was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, serving four terms. Barletta was the Republican candidate for U.S. Senate in 2018, facing incumbent Sen. Bob Casey Jr., D-Pa. A strong opponent of illegal immigration, Barletta was a member of former President Donald Trump's transition team.

Jake Corman (Centre County)

Corman was elected to the state Senate in 1998 and is currently serving as the senate president pro tempore, the top Republican leader in the chamber. He is touting his fight against Gov. Wolf's overreaching executive orders during the pandemic, his support for education and school choice and his support for the business community.

Joe Gale (Montgomery County)

Gale is a Montgomery County commissioner who ran against the endorsed party candidate and won. He has identified himself as an independent conservative outsider. Gale's platform is focused on his track record as a leader who will fight for conservative values as governor.

Charlie Gerow (Cumberland County)

Gerow currently serves as the vice chair of CPAC and the American Conservative Union. He is a longtime political commentator and communications consultant. Gerow is portraying himself as an independent choice. Along with pro-business policies, one of his priorities includes allowing voters to recall a governor.

Melissa Hart (Allegheny County)

Hart served in the state Senate and was later elected to the U.S. House of Representatives. For the past 14 years, she has worked as an attorney representing small businesses. Her platform focuses on supporting policies that will lead to economic growth, job creation, lower taxes, and lower inflation.

Doug Mastriano (Franklin County)

Mastriano is a retired colonel in the U.S. Army. He currently serves as a state senator in Franklin County. He is identifying himself as an outsider and not beholden to party establishment. Mastriano’s platform includes protecting taxpayers, protecting life, protecting the Second Amendment, and protecting families.

Bill McSwain (Chester County)

McSwain is a U.S. Marine veteran and a former U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, appointed by former President Trump. His priorities as governor are to strength the economy, reduce crime, support school choice, and ensure elections are secure. McSwain received the endorsement of Commonwealth Partners, an association that supports pro-business and conservative candidates.

David White (Delaware County)

White owns a plumbing and HVAC company in Delaware County. He is a third-generation union steamfitter and former county councilman. His platform includes supporting pro-growth policies that will position Pennsylvania to be the preferred location for businesses looking to relocate.

A cardiothoracic surgeon, Zama’s platform includes touting his experience as a humanitarian and skilled surgeon. He believes that Pennsylvania’s public policies have been “sick,” and Harrisburg is too broken to properly support the economy, education, and health care systems. He is running to address these and other issues.

Josh Shapiro (Montgomery County)

Shapiro currently serves as Pennsylvania’s attorney general. Prior to his election, he served as a state representative and before that he was chair of the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners. He is promoting himself as “a reformer who takes on big fights.” Shapiro is touting his track record of exposing child abuse, holding elected officials and business leaders accountable and protecting the right to vote.

John Brown (Northampton County)

Brown is a member of the Northampton County Council and is a former county executive.



Jeff Coleman (Armstrong County)

Coleman is a former state representative from western Pennsylvania. After leaving public service in 2004, he has worked as a political consultant.

Teddy Daniels (Wayne County)

Daniels is a U.S. Army combat veteran and retired law enforcement officer. He owns a small business that does consulting work for the cannabis industry.

Carrie Lewis DelRosso (Allegheny County)




Conor Lamb (Allegheny County)


